

## **Professor Matthew Jackson, Stanford University (Game Theory)**

Matthew O. Jackson is the William D. Eberle Professor of Economics at Stanford University and an external faculty member of the Santa Fe Institute. He received his BA from Princeton University in 1984 and his PhD from Stanford University in 1988. Jackson's research interests include the study of social and economic networks. He has also made contributions in game theory, mechanism design, political economy, and microeconomic theory. Jackson has received the Social Choice and Welfare Prize, a Guggenheim Fellowship, the B.E. Press Arrow Prize for Senior Economists, and has delivered the Nancy Schwartz Lecture and the Fischer Schultz Lecture. He is a Fellow of the Econometric Society and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.
